NIP Credits Available

Hope for Appalachia has been issued NIP Credits. If you pay taxes in West Virginia and you contribute \$500 or more, you can get a tax credit of 50% of your contribution. That means that your contribution of \$1,000, for example, would cost you only \$500, plus you can also claim the deduction on your federal taxes.
